

Guía de acceso a los informes individuales de los estudiantes para los exámenes estatales (BOG, Check-Ins, EOCs, EOGs)

Para poder tener acceso a los informes individuales de su hijo de BOG, Check-Ins 2.0, EOC o EOGs, es necesario tener acceso al Portal de Padres. Es muy fácil de obtener y manejar y le da acceso a las calificaciones y asistencia de su hijo durante todo el año escolar.

1. Vaya a la página inicial de la escuela de su hijo. Para obtener una lista de todas las páginas de internet de nuestras escuelas, puede visitar www.asheschools.org y utilizar el menú desplegable situado a la derecha de la pantalla para seleccionar la escuela.
2. Para fines ilustrativos, estamos utilizando el sitio de Ashe County High para indicar dónde ubicar el acceso. En el banner morado de la parte superior de la página, elija "Para padres".




3. En el menú desplegable, seleccione Portal de padres.



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- Inicie sesión en el Portal de padres de Powerschool con nombre de usuario y contraseña. De nuevo, si no tiene un nombre de usuario y contraseña, póngase en contacto con el administrador de PowerSchool en la escuela para obtener esa información. Por motivos de seguridad, es necesario mostrar una identificación con fotografía al realizar el acceso inicial.


