

Ashe County Schools Superintendent, Dr. Eisa Cox, along with Julie Taylor, Director of K-12 Curriculum & Federal Programs; Casey Smith, K-5 Literacy Curriculum Coordinator; Courtney Eller, ACS STEM Innovator; Karee Mackey, ACS GEAR UP Coordinator; and other ACS staffers attended. The event also recognized Pitch Competition grant winners at the Gear Up Innovation Expo. Winners included Tonya Denny, BRES Media Coordinator, who won a \$10K grant and Jonathan Greene, English teacher at Ashe Early College High School, who won a \$5K grant. 
