Ashe County Schools Receives Top 10 Ranking in North Carolina for 2023-24 Academic Year

Ashe County Schools is thrilled to announce outstanding performance in the 2023-24 North Carolina End-of-Course (EOC) and End-of-Grade (EOG) assessments. The district has earned a prestigious TOP 10, ranking 9th of 115 school districts statewide, showcasing dedication to academic excellence.

In addition to these remarkable rankings, 100% of elementary and middle schools in Ashe County met or exceeded academic growth expectations. This achievement highlights the district's ongoing commitment to fostering educational progress. Notably, Ashe County Middle School ranks in the top 3% of all schools in North Carolina for academic growth and the Graduation Rate for Ashe County Schools has climbed to 88.89%, the highest in Ashe County Schools' history, surpassing the State of North Carolina.


